Applied Biosafety: Journal of ABSAs International

Dear Colleagues,

Applied Biosafety now features article sharing. Journal subscribers will now be able to share read-only access to an article by sending article links that recipients can then use to view the article in a browser environment without having to be a subscriber. The links can be shared via email, on social media sites, and within scholarly collaboration networks, encouraging greater discoverability of your content and enhancing its impact through legitimate sharing options. Each link is valid for 90 days after it is sent and has no limit on the number of times it can be shared during that time period.

The new "share access" option will be available on all non-Open Access content published since 2016 and visible to authenticated SAGE Journal users, whether authenticated through their society membership or via an institutional or individual subscription, through the existing Share option in the Article Menu area of each article. 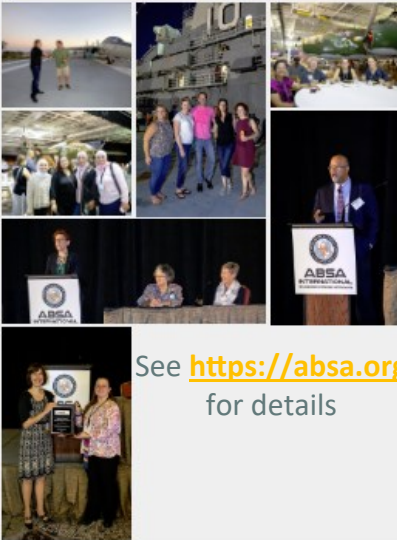
